Quarter 3 – Week 4


WDJWMTD



Materials: 7 clothespins, rope/string, permanent markers, Bible verse templates (provided), scissors.

Instructions:

Prepare a long and fun strand of string/rope (approximately 2-3 feet); With a permanent marker, write the following letters on 7 clothespins: **WDJWMTD** (one letter per clothespin); cut out the Bible verse templates and clip onto each clothespin. Each letter stands for 1 day of the 7-day week. Each day take a letter/Bible Verse off the rope and write an idea that you have which you can do that day, that goes along the Bible Verse which is shown. Flip the verse around to the back so that **your** idea can be seen for the day.



Teaching with the Craft:

Because sin and evil still exists in our world, life can be pretty unfair. But while we are still living here on this earth, we have the opportunity to share who Jesus is with everyone in the world, good and bad. Jesus can help us to remain faithful to Him during it all! As we remember to spend time with Him by reading the Bible, praying, and really thinking about how much He loves us and everyone else too, we can choose how we will react to the people and situations around us. When we stay close to Jesus and study how He lived His life, and how much he loved people, it helps us to want to do the same. Obviously, we are not Jesus, but we can think about what Jesus would want us to do in order to be loving as well. The letters WWJD stand for “What Would Jesus Do?”. The letters you have written on your clothespins say WDJWMTD. These letters represent: “What Does Jesus Want Me To Do?” The Holy Spirit gives us the ability to live our lives with the gifts, talents, and personalities He has given to us. With Jesus first, we live our lives doing what He wants us to do, with the special person that we are. Each of us is unique. Each of us has something amazing to share; FAITH! Faith, Truth, and Love! No matter what kind of a day you’re having, ask yourself, “What Does Jesus Want Me to Do? How should my actions show that I love Jesus? Each day, this week, pick one of your clothespin letters and write down a way that you can show what Jesus Wants You to Do that reflects the Bible verse written. Have fun! (*We have done an example one for you.*)
