TAKEAWAY	The Ten Commandments serve as the foundation of law and morality. This study illustrates how God works with His people to guide and protect them by establishing rules for society. Students will evaluate the consequences of rebellion and discover the value of following rules even when they may not yet understand them. Students will also investigate the positive and negative experiences of the time in the wilderness in order to adopt a lifestyle of faithfulness to God.		As Joshua began his campaign to lead the Israelites into the Promised Land, God showed the Israelites over and over again that their faith would always lead them in the right direction. This study provides examples of how we can learn from the Israelites as they forged onward with impossible goals with God at their helm. God fulfills His promises when people trust and obey His Word.		Performance and judgment might be good motivators for a while, but they rob people of the gift that Jesus came to offer the world—life abundantly. Rather than focus on an external checklist of dos and don'ts, these lessons direct students to examine a relationship with Christ as the measure and motivation for behavior.		The book of Matthew highlights the nature and authority of Jesus as the rightful King of Heaven and earth and analyzes how unique situations in His life reflect His sovereignty in accomplishing His purpose. Students will be encouraged toward a view of Christ as the reigning King and intentionally live as citizens of His eternal kingdom, while seeking to attract others to Christ.		God gives us all things to enjoy, but we must maintain perspective and avoid allowing anything other than God to become an object of worship and purpose for living. No matter how good something might be, absolutely anything can be twisted into barrier that stands between you and the Lord.		The book of Judges gives us insight into the relationship God wants with us and the consequences of choosing to go our own way. The Israelites demonstrate for us how poor decisions lead to a destructive cycle of disobedience and show how God's continued mercy and grace lead us to forgiveness, freedom, and success.

TAKEAWAY	Students will also learn that while it may seem that bad people tend to prosper, God's justice will ultimately prevail. Students will be challenged in this unit to daily choose to live for God and to grow in Christ even during difficult times. They are encouraged to pray for those who do not know Jesus as Savior and look for ways to introduce them to Him. They will also be reminded to make the right choice, even in the little things.	Paul's letters to the Thessalonians addressed issues faced by believers of the first century as well as the 21st century: humility, integrity, holiness, wisdom, truth, and much more. Believers must find the balance between living in this world and looking forward to Heaven. Paul offers a treasure of practical advice on getting along with other believers and building a healthy, godly community within the church.		The examples of Ruth and Hannah show us how confident faith in God can impact a person's life and even influence nations. Faith is about more than just belonging to a community, it's about a life-changing relationship. Ruth and Hannah understood that and it made all the difference.		Integrity is a character trait that differentiates extraordinary people from common society. Select heroes of the faith are highlighted for being commended by God for their integrity. Students will see that the key to integrity is leaving the consequences of making the right choice up to God, so that even if their integrity leads to trouble or unfairness, they will recognize that God is in control and trust His direction.		"In Christ" is a common phrase in 1 Corinthians, but what does it actually mean on a practical level to live a life and make decisions "in Christ"? The students will investigate this question and examine some of the effects and benefits of choosing the present, active relationship with Jesus that leads to a life lived in Christ.		Believers in Christ are assured of certain benefits, including spiritual gifts, belonging within the body of Christ, and the hope of eternal life. In this continuing study of 1 Corinthians, students explore the benefits believers have today and for the future. With all the privilege that comes with being a believer, there is also great responsibility.
